You should maintain a portfolio of authentic assessments, i.e., the Pre-Kindergarten Assessment Tool Kit, for each pre-kindergarten child.

Collecting 'Work Samples' from each child is essential. This is in no means asking for teachers to give worksheets or paper-and-pencil tasks to the children--that should be kept to a bare minimum!
