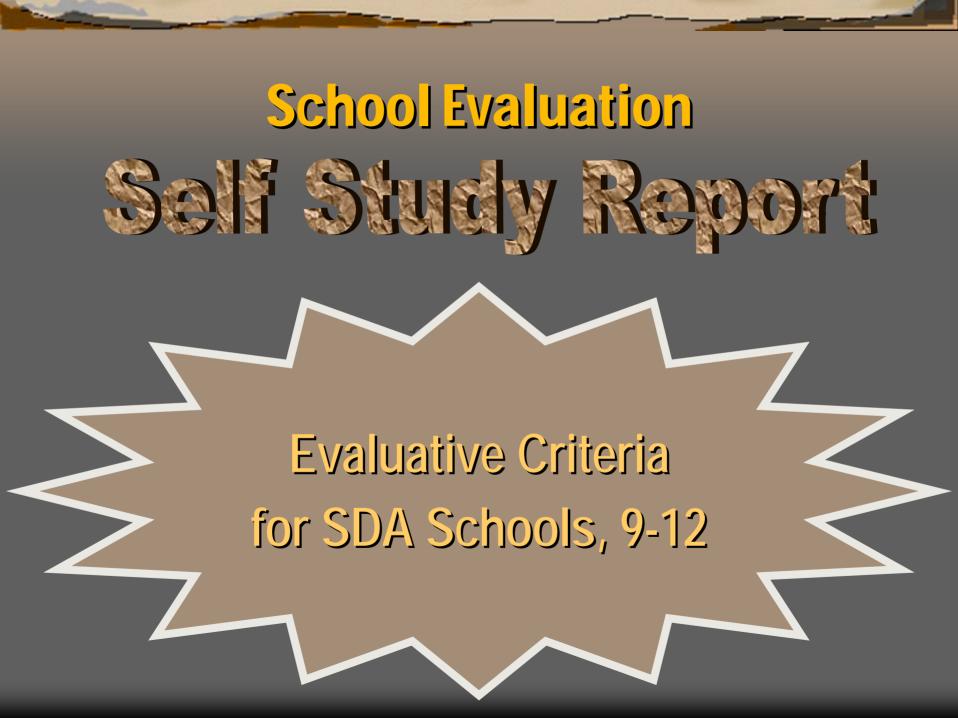

Self Study Report

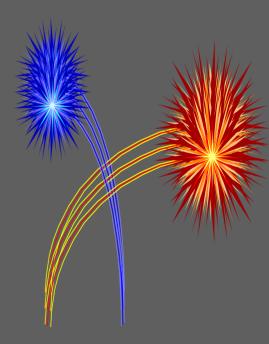
The evaluative instrument is:

- In narrative format
- Based on improvement planning
- Seeks accountability to standards
- Focused on school/student performance

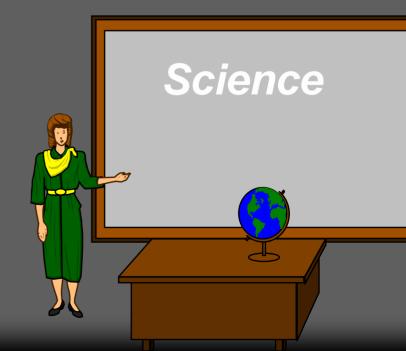

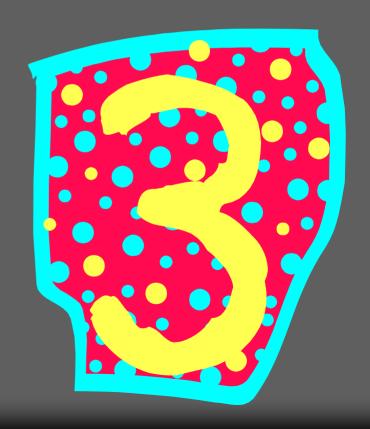

- Who is addressed
- For what reason
- Documentation



- Who is addressed
 - ⇒ specific people by groups . . . constituency, board,
 administration, staff



- Who is addressed
- For what reason COMMENDATIONS:
 - Improvements
 - Specific strengths
 - Innovative programs
 - Good plans for improvement
 - Commend only those things that are over and above the expected.

- Who is addressed
- For what reason RECOMMENDATIONS:
 - Major Recommendations
 - What are the main themes that need to be addressed?
 - 4 to 7 maximum
 - Safety concerns are always majors
 - Punch list repairs do not belong in the report. They should be given separately to principal.



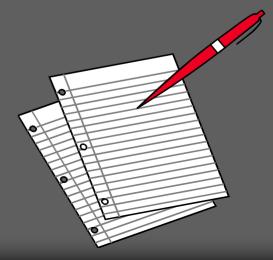
- Who is addressed
- For what reason **RECOMMENDATIONS**:
 - Unimplemented recommendations
 - Standards not adequately met
 - Specific Instructional needs
 - Inadequate plans for improvement
 - 15 20 recommendations



- Who is addressed
- ▲ For what reason *RECOMMENDATIONS:*
 - The phrase "give study" should be used only when a recommendation involves money.
