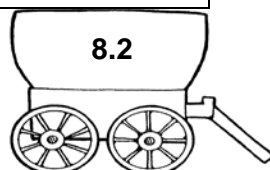

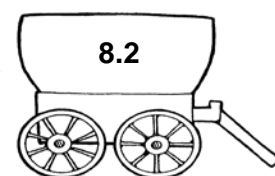
Book 2 – A Day on the Prairie

First grade students were introduced to DOL procedures in Theme 4 (Spiritual Journey/Giving Gifts). Teachers should provide explicit instruction, scaffolding, and direction until 1st grade students are accustomed to the editing process.
