

Dark blue, the color of Lapiz Lazuli, a semi-precious stone mainly found in Afghanistan, was chosen as the outline which encases the following symbols of this 'Afghanistan Heart Symbol':

- •The National Emblem of Afghanistan
- •Minaret-e-Jam is a UNESCO World Heritage site, located in Western Afghanistan, in the province of Ghor.
- •Red tulip is the national flower of Afghanistan and the symbol of Nowroz, the Afghan New Year.
- •Dambura is a <u>lute played mainly in Tajik and Uzbek folk</u> music.
- •Buzkashi is the national sport of Afghanistan
- •Afghan green grapes are famous in Central Asia and are a major export, both fresh and dried as green raisins, to neighboring countries.
- •Hindukush Mountains, an 800-kilometer mountain range that runs through Afghanistan and has been written about in folktales and modern novels.
- •Afghan woman in traditional clothes doing the <u>Afghan national dance--attan</u>. Traditionally attan was performed by men but now both men and women perform this communal dance at end of a wedding, engagement or and Nowroz celebrations.

- •Rubab is a lute-like instrument played by trained masters and their students in classic Afghan music. <u>It's the national</u> instrument of Afghanistan.
- •Shrine of Hazrat-e-Ali, is <u>one of Afghanistan's most</u> <u>beautiful and most revered mosque, located in Mazar-i-</u> Sharif, in the northern province of Balkh.
- •Qabili Palau is the <u>national dish of Afghanistan</u>.
- •Buddhas of Bamiyan were two, 6th-century statues carved into the side of a cliff in Bamiyan valley. The historically significant monuments were defaced by the Taliban in 2001 and now they stand as a stark reminder of the cultural and human destruction that could return if the Taliban gain power in Afghanistan.
- •Pomegranate is the national fruit of Afghanistan.
- •Tabla is a pair of hand drums, from the Indian Subcontinent, used as a percussion instrument in most Afghan folk and classical music. <u>Salar Nader is a talented and sought after Afghan percussionist who lives in California.</u>
- •Kite flying is the <u>national pastime for Afghan men and boys</u>. Afghanistan's kite flying scene was made world famous by Khaled Hosseini's book The Kite Runner.
