

Kindergarten students can actively participate in DOL activities for the purpose of introduction, exposure, and review, but are not expected to do written sentences. First grade students were introduced to DOL procedures in Theme 4 (*Spiritual Journey/Giving Gifts*). Teachers should provide explicit instruction, scaffolding, and direction until 1<sup>st</sup> grade students are accustomed to the editing process.
